Season Preview - from the Gazette: "Warragul and District Cricket Association will celebrate its 50th Anniversary Season by entering two teams in Country Week. The additional team will seek affiliation in B-Grade in place of the Bunyip and District Cricket Association – now in recess.

Two clubs from the BDCA – Longwarry and the combined Garfield RSL-Bunyip team – were admitted at the WDCA Annual Meeting last Monday Night. Garfield RSL-Bunyip will field teams in A-Grade, A-Reserve, B-Grade, and two in the Juniors. Its A-Grade side will play at Garfield and all others at Cora Lynn as Bunyip Oval has been closed for a drainage project this summer. Longwarry entered teams in A-Reserve and B-Grade and its headquarters will be at Longwarry.

The entry of the former BDCA clubs has worried Willow Grove which may switch to Central Gippsland to obviate a travelling problem. (Willow Grove was not present at the Annual Meeting). Re-elected President Mr. Tom Carroll will contact Willow Grove officials this week to ascertain their future intentions. Points in favour of staying are:

- It is a 50th Anniversary season.
- Travelling to Cora Lynn is only a once each two-seasons trip for Willow Grove teams.
- Cora Lynn Oval is one of the best in Gippsland – a reward for the inconvenience of a long trip from Willow Grove.

Neerim District and Hallora have withdrawn from B-Grade leaving this competition with 10 teams – the same as last season. There will be nine teams in A-Grade, 12 in A-Reserve, and 11 in the juniors if Willow Grove remain in the WDCA. The overall total of 42 teams is a WDCA record.

Turf Wicket for Western Park – from Gazette (20th September): "Western Park is to have a turf cricket pitch. Warragul Council decided this last Tuesday. Cr. A. G. Farrington said despite investigations into a synthetic pitch, the Western Park Development Committee was still strongly in favour of a turf wicket. Members had countered arguments that the weather unsuitable by saying that Warragul's weather was the basically the same as in Melbourne and many other country centres. And possibly was drier than England's in the cricket season. Cr. Farrington said committee members would do their utmost to find someone to maintain the wicket. He said: "They feel once having got the wicket; it will be easier to get a groundsman. And, the Department of Agriculture has offered its expertise and advice, free."

Cr. Farrington said the turf wicket would cost about \$1500 – with an area big enough for four wickets. This was about the same as the cost of a synthetic wicket. Cr. Farrington said the committee would be prepared to lay and maintain the wicket if council supplied the materials. Shire President Cr. M. V. Goynes said he was concerned schools may not be able to use the turf wicket. Cr. Farrington said if Warragul had had a turf wicket some years ago, a local boy probably would have been a Test cricketer today. There was no reason why schools could not use the oval in the normal way – and particularly for interschool matches. However, uncontrolled play there after school could not be allowed. Council voted to supply materials for a turf wicket, to be prepared and maintained by the committee."



Name Change for St. Andrews – from the Gazette: "St. Andrews will play as Western Park in Warragul and District cricket this season. They will play at Western Park when the new oval is ready for cricket, possibly at the end of this season."

Incorrect Cricket Gear Out! – *from the Gazette:* "The WDCA is frowning on incorrect attire being worn by senior cricketers. President Mr. Tom Carroll said today the WDCA will insist that all its A-Grade players wear correct attire. Other grades will be given more leniency, but it's hoped they also dress correctly. Coloured shirts and jumpers are out, and whites are in. The only colour permitted will be stripes in jumpers or cricket caps. Floppy hats must be white in the spruce up ultimatum. Mr. Carroll said players attire is laid down clearly in Australian Board of Control regulations. "We intend to conform with these regulations," he said. "Some players will wear anything unless we make a stand."

Knock Out Cricket! – *from the Gazette*: “Three Ellinbank players suffered facial injuries in Warragul and District cricket mishaps on Saturday. New Association score secretary Bill Pratt – fielding at silly mid-on – was flattened when Western Park batsman Neil Robertson drove a full toss into his face in the A-Grade game at Warragul Technical School Oval. Pratt was taken to West Gippsland Hospital for an x-ray for possible bone damage. Ten minutes later, wicketkeeper Ernie Dessent was hit under the left eye by a ball that shot up at him after skidding past the stumps. He had to leave the ground with a suspected bone fracture and was replaced as keeper by John Atherton.

Frank Brody – playing in B-Grade for Ellinbank – was struck in the eye by a ball and suffered severe bruising. Despite their unpleasant knocks, all three players expect to be back with their respective teams next Saturday. Slow outfields and lack of practice told on batsmen in the first round after Christmas. Western Park – battling to hold fourth place – were 7/68 against Ellinbank, but a stand of 78 for the eighth wicket by Robertson (52) and Des Ricardo (42 n.o.) enabled them to reach 154. A devastating opening spell by Laurie Pitt and Peter Zuber saw Ellinbank 2/2 at stumps. Zuber – a Country Week aspirant – was back in the Western Park team after standing down for several matches over a clearance dispute.”

The only other surviving life member — Mr Joe Cumming of Warragul — sent an apology.

Guests were welcomed by WDCA president Mr Tom Carroll who gave a short summary of cricket in Warragul and District since the first recorded game in 1910.

This was played on a green known as the Triangle — present site of the Bank of New South Wales in Warragul.

Mr Carroll said records indicate that cricket was played on a purely social basis up to World War I.

Warragul "Gazette" records show that some organised cricket was played in Central Gippsland and Pakenham after the war.

The WDCA was formed in 1928 with six teams — Warragul West, Drouin West, Trafalgar, Presbyterian-Church of Christ,

Methodist-Church of England and Ellinbank.

This competition gradually expanded and only this season included new clubs from Garfield, Bunyip and Longwarry.

This raised WDCA strength to 14 clubs with 30 senior teams and 11 under 16 sides

Names recorded in a visitors book will be published next week.

Bob Baldry, who rose from the WDCA to represent Victoria and is currently Colliingwood captain in District cricket was present.

The only other WDCA

player to play Shield cricket — Bruce Tozer — was unable to attend.

The reunion weekend concluded with a special inter-Association match at Drouin on Sunday.

This important document officially records the foundation of the Warragul and District Cricket Association.

It details officials (except secretary) and the six affiliated clubs.

It was on display at the WDCA 50th anniversary re-union last Saturday night.
