From the Gazette: “Western Park picked up a very good 42-run win over reigning premier Yarragon. Chasing 200, and batting with Rick Minichiello unavailable, Yarragon was bowled out for 158. Opener Peter Mazza did a fine job to make 50 runs while brother Nick (21) and Graham Lake (34) also did well. Western Park’s Paul Hughes bowled unchanged from one end sending down 29 overs and was rewarded with 5/68 (including five maidens). Mick Roberts also did a good job taking 3/64 off 21.5 overs.”

From the Gazette: “Western Park Cricket Club has ripped up its pitch and cement slab and a new one will be constructed soon. The new slab will be raised about three inches to bring it up to the level of the surrounding grass area. No cricket has been played at Western Park this season because of ground maintenance, and it is hoped the new pitch and surrounds can be ready for the Round 7 matches on January 9.”

(Mid-Season Review): “At the halfway mark of the WDCA season, the ladders and likely finalist are starting to sort themselves out. Drouin has been the surprise packet in A-Grade, and with five wins in a row has cleared out to be two wins ahead of the bunch on 33 points. Following Drouin – all on 21 points – are Yarragon, Western Park, Ellinbank, and Nilma-Dusties. The disappointing team in A-Grade this year has been Buln which are yet to register a win. Warragul (18 points) and Longwarry (15) still have a narrow chance of a finals berth but would need to win at least three and possibly four of the last five games.”

They will join forces with a number of top cricketers across Gippsland. Jones, Reiffel, and Dodemaide are all in contention for a place in the Australian touring party to England late in the year. O'Donnell is currently captain of the Victorian side and is recapturing some of his old form. Lehmann and Nobes are mighty strikers of the ball and will provide great entertainment.

To have such high-quality Victorian players appearing locally should provide a great deal of interest for cricket lovers. Sale-Maffra’s star – pace bowler Dean Benson – will lead the team from the East, while the brilliant Tom Anton from Traralgon will captain the team from the West. Neil Tattersson – who made a great century for Country Victoria last week – will be playing, as will Warragul’s paceman Paul Hughes. B-Grade Report (by John Donnellon from the Western Park CC Annual Report)

This season was one which could only be described as disappointing and frustrating. We had a team that was certainly capable of winning games, but at no stage did we challenge for a place in the finals. Factors such as the rain and early season washouts, and not playing a home game at Western Park did not help our cause, but it is the players who must ultimately take the blame for the season's poor showing.

The batting remained our biggest downfall for the year. It appeared to be strong on paper but didn't perform as expected. The main problem was that players would get out soon after getting a start. On too many occasions a top-order batsman would lose his wicket in the early 20's or 30's when a big innings of over 50 was required. Chris Downward and Darren Bailey were easily our best performed batsmen for the year. Chris once again did a great job opening the batting and put in some solid efforts. 'Basil' Bailey batted at number three most games and often found himself in there very early with the task of steadying the innings. He handled the occasion very well but unfortunately got out around the 30-run mark on a few occasions when he looked set for a big score. Chris showed great commitment to his batting and fully deserved his batting average trophy. His concentration level has improved, and he always tried hard to put value on his wicket, and not to go out to bad balls as he was prone to do a couple of seasons back. Chris was also the recipient of the Captain's Trophy. He made himself available for selection every game and his endeavour to do well for the team and club are to be commended.

The bulk of the bowling this year was done by the experience John 'Whale' Laffy and youngster Chris Hinsley. John would have to be considered most unlucky as he bowled 95 overs at less than 2.5 runs per over but only managed to snag 4 wickets for the season. His effort however to lead the attack and bowl tightly are to be applauded. Chris Hinsley won the bowling average with 13 wickets as an average of just under 30. He has all the attributes to be a very good medium-fast bowler with his even rhythm and lovely high action. The most encouraging aspect of his game is that he appears to have an unlimited amount of improvement left in him and in the following seasons we will hopefully see him develop further and play a couple of games in the A's.

With this season being very disappointing, I can only hope that the players are looking forward to season 1993-94 where we will have the chance to atone. Getting back on our home wicket, where we remained undefeated in season 1991-92 should give the team back some much-needed confidence. The side is definitely capable of winning games, so next season if we play good attacking cricket, a finals berth is not beyond our grasp.

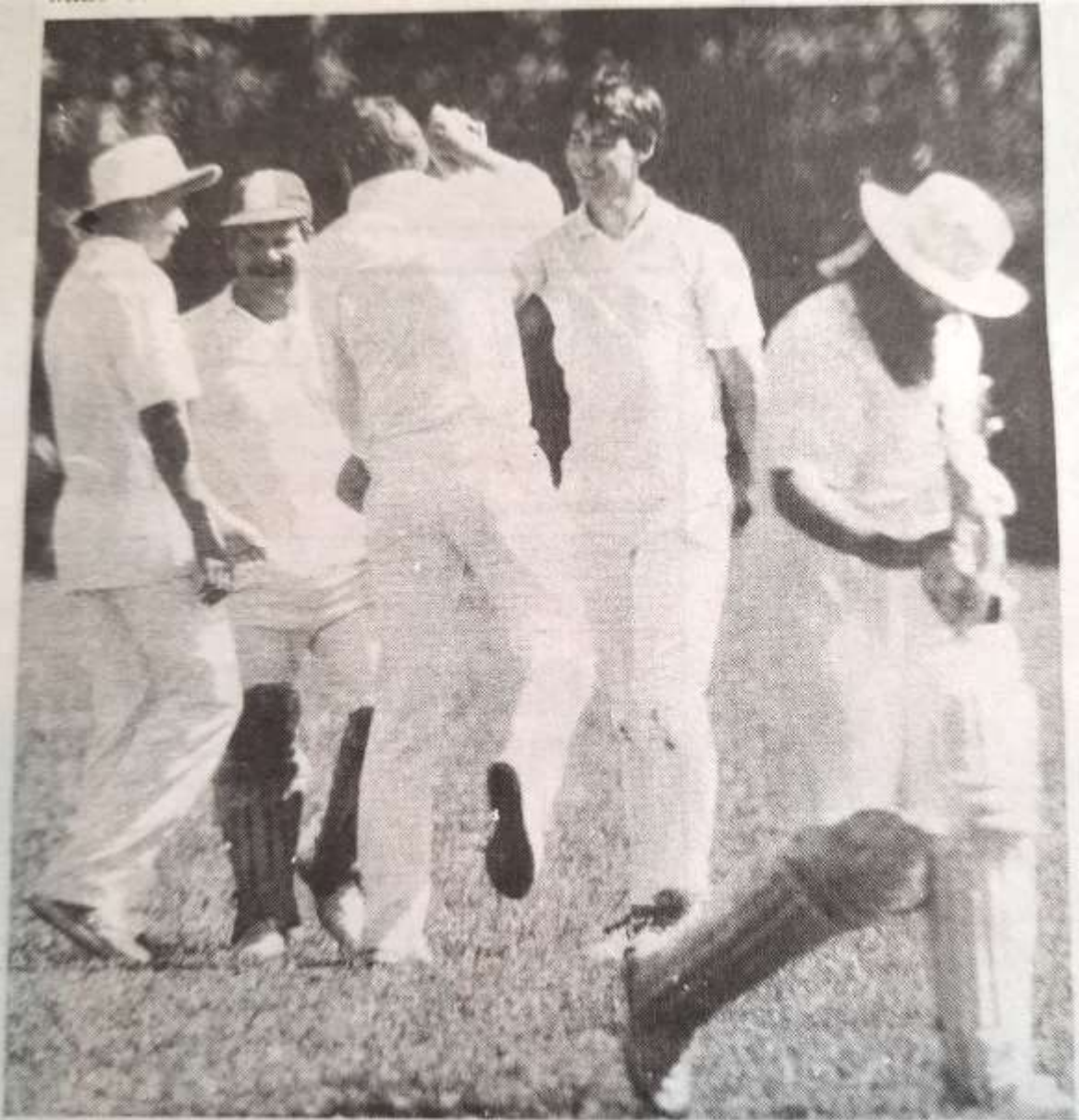
