Off-Season News

Complex Opened – *from the Gazette*: “The Western Park Oval was described by the Minister for Youth Sport and Recreation – Mr. Brian Dixon – on Saturday as a “magnificent complex”. Several hundred people were at the ground for the opening of the \$250 000 complex. Mr. Dixon called for efforts to ensure the ground was utilised to its full potential, a sentiment echoed by the Chairman of the Management Committee, Mr. Greg Answerth. He said the complex belonged to the people and – as a community project – people should “protect it from vandalism and support, both physically and financially, future efforts to develop a complex second-to-none and worthy of the town and shire of Warragul”. The official speakers were introduced by the Warragul Shire President Cr. Mike Goyne who also said the town had inherited something to be proud of. Mr. Answerth said today he has stressed to Mr. Dixon that the development of the park still had some way to go. His committee urgently needed more money – already applied for – to build changing rooms and a pavilion for the netball and tennis players, extra parking space, and more catering facilities.”

Des Ricardo Stands Down – *from the Gazette (August 29th)*: “Western Park cricket stalwart Mr. Des Ricardo has ended a four-year term as Club President. His successor Mr. Ian Clark has warmly praised Mr. Ricardo’s work for the club and also in the development of Western Park: “A club life member, Des has contributed work worth hundreds of dollars organising working bees at Western Park”, Mr. Clark said today. “His overall involvement has been outstanding, and he will be a proud man when the first ball is bowled on the turf wicket at the new ground.” Mr. Clark expects Western Park to develop as one of Gippsland’s showpieces when present teething problems are obviated.

Because eight of its juniors are too old for the junior competition, Western Park intends to retain their interest by entering a third senior team in the WDCA this season. A finance committee has been formed to raise funds to cover costs of starting the new team and the recent purchase of an electric roller for turf wicket management. Mr. Clark said his club would be looking to the Shire of Warragul and the WDCA for both financial and practical experience as international teams are certain to play at Western Park in the near future. Vice-President Mr. Peter Ross will coach the juniors this season – taking over from Mr. Ian Day – who did the job successfully for a number of seasons. Mr. Neil Robertson is Club Secretary-Treasurer, and Mr. Laurie Pitt is Assistant Secretary-Treasurer.

The club is disappointed that it was unable to secure the services of Mr. Tom Carroll as coach as it was felt he would have been the ideal tutor for the many young players in the club. Western Park hopes to obtain a top cricketer for the position of coach. It also welcomes potential new players (as well as former players) to join any of its teams this season. A disco dance will be held at the Railway Hotel Warragul on September 9th to set the season rolling.”

Yarragon Out of A-Grade – *from the Gazette*: “Yarragon has dropped out of Warragul and District A-Grade cricket. However, it seems certain the WDCA executive will promote last season’s A-Reserve premiers Longwarry to obviate a bye in A-Grade. Longwarry delegate Mr. Les Coster said he personally wanted Longwarry to play in A-Grade but had been out-voted at the club annual meeting. He felt that if the executive promoted Longwarry (and under the constitution it does have this right) he was sure his club would meet the challenge.... Garfield RSL-Bunyip have decided to drop the RSL part of their combined name. Mr. Tom Carroll was elected without opposition as President, and so were the two Vice-Presidents and life members Messrs Don Thompson and Charlie Pierrehumbert. Messrs Geoff Browne and Ian Findlay, who spent part of last season touring the Continent, were re-elected Secretary and Treasurer respectively...Western Park, who are fielding a new team in B-Grade, are uncertain about the turf wicket at Western Park being available before Christmas. Their B-Grade team may play at Warragul Tech Oval, delegate Mr. Ian Clark told the meeting.”

Western Park Furious Over Oval Apathy – *from the Gazette (November 21st):* “Western Park Cricket Club is unhappy about not being able to use the new Western Park Oval so far this season. Mr. Ian Clark said today the club is “furious” that no one seems interested in whether the oval is used or not. He directed most of attack on the Warragul Shire for the alleged lack of interest. “Many long hours of voluntary labour have gone into making Western Park a Warragul sports showpiece”, he said. “Instead of being an object of pride, it has become an embarrassment to the township. Unless there is some major construction undertaken soon, the oval will be closed to football next season. We have just about given up hope of playing cricket there this season.”

Mr. Clark said Western Park Cricket Club and the WDCA have donated labour worth hundreds of dollars to the project: “Apart from the labour, we have made donations and purchased an electric roller – yet the shire does not appear impressed. A \$250 000 investment in a sports oval allowed to remain idle for half a year seems to be a gross waste of public money to my committee.” Mr. Clark said the Shire should immediately start working on re-draining and re-surfacing the oval to give cricketers and footballers a chance to use it next year. “I am certain (and it is my clubs opinion) that if this work was required in any other shire, it would be carried out”, he said. “So why do we have such an apathetic situation in the Warragul Shire?”

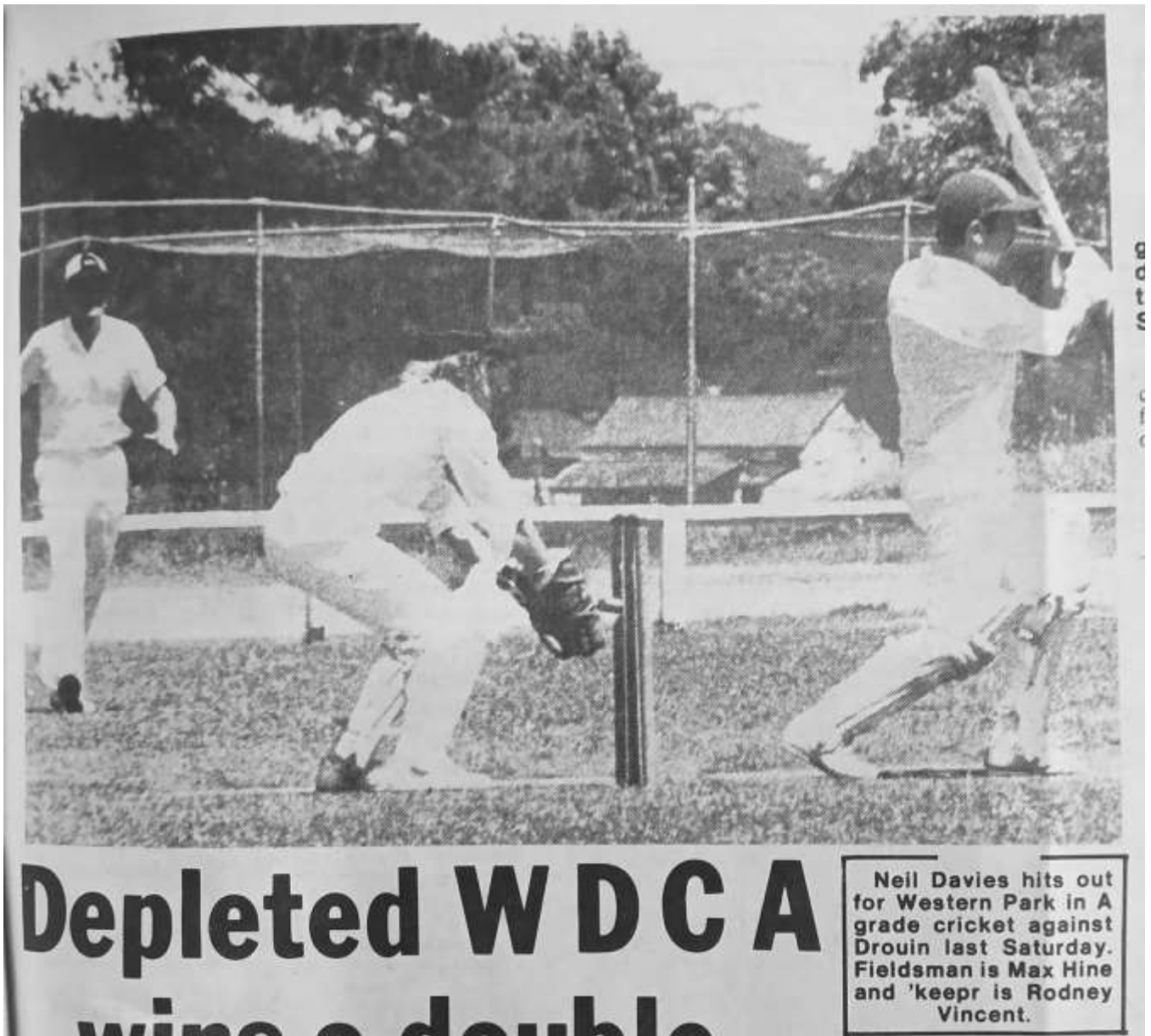

\$7530 Western Park Grant – *from the Gazette (December 5th):* “Warragul Council has allocated a \$7530 grant to re-drain the Western Park Oval. The money was approved at the Council estimates meeting on Monday of last week. Shire Engineer Mr. Ken Langdon said today that re-drainage work would start immediately. It appears that the clay between the former surface and drainage pipes prevented surface water from being cleared. The clay will be removed, and more suitable soil placed there. More drainage pipes will be centred around the turf wicket area. Mr. Langdon said seed will be sown as soon as practicable. He added there is a chance the oval will be ready for football next year. Western Park committee of management member Mr. Greg Answerth hailed the grant as a major breakthrough: “We now have the green light to get Western Park working as a major sports facility in Warragul”, he said. Western Park Cricket Club, which recently criticised the Council for the continued drainage problem, is also delighted to see action at last on the way.”

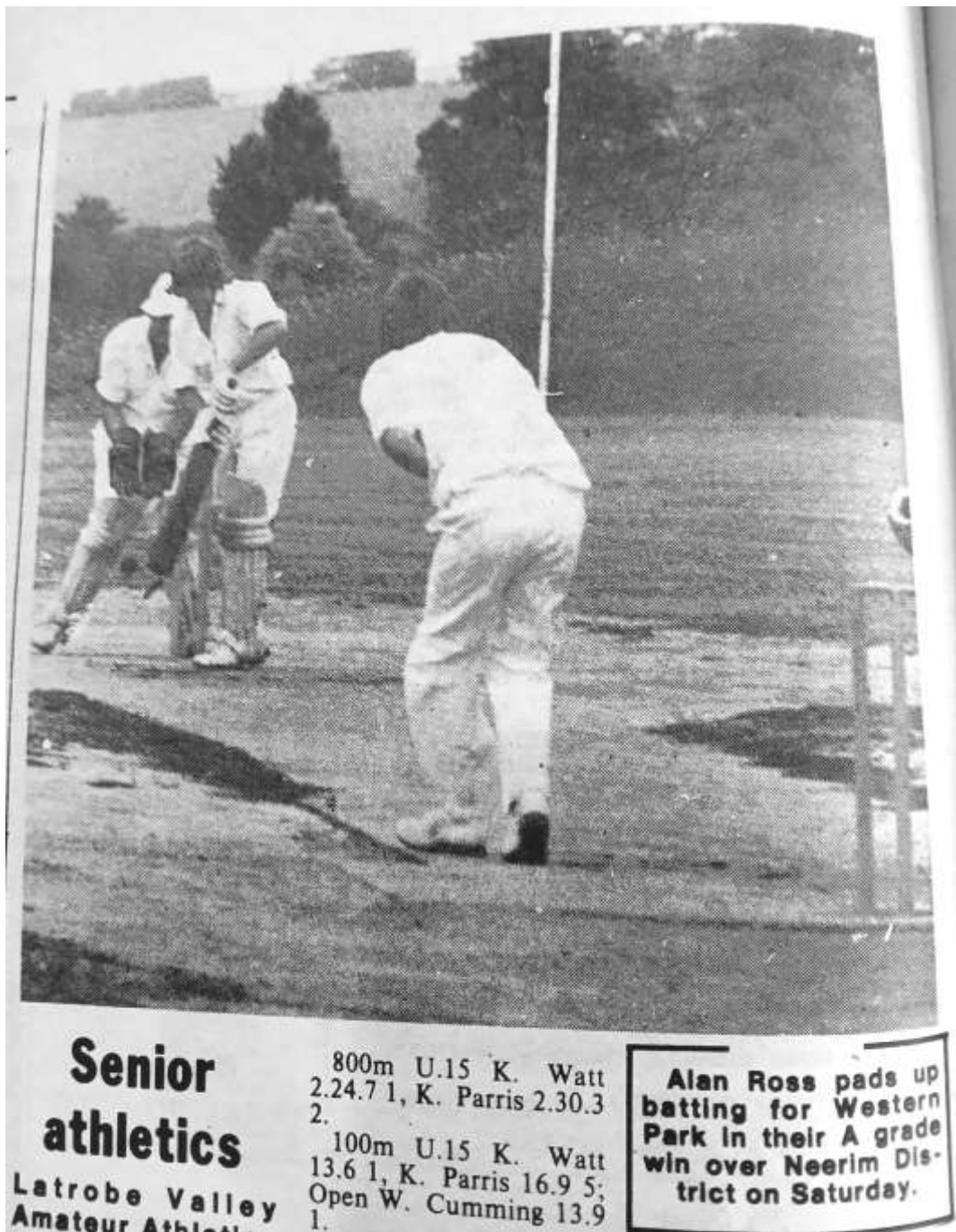
