From the Gazette: “**Western Park Going Well** – Warragul’s almost forgotten \$200 000 sports oval – Western Park – is about to hit news headlines again. Officially opened two years ago and closed again a few weeks later owing to drainage problems, the oval is soon to be opened again. Management committee president Mr. Greg Anwerth tipped today the first cricket match of turf will be played there just after Christmas. Council staff led by Mr. Rex Hannah were working on the pitch area today. New grass is growing well, and depressions are being filled carefully by hand to avoid damage to the grass. The whole wet pitch area has been opened up, drained, and covered with soil that will absorb average rain. Clubs keen to use Western Park have been waiting patiently, and at some expense for a long time. Present indications suggest the long wait is nearly over for those interested.”

From the Gazette: “Longwarry leg spinner, Robert Thomas, took the ‘hat-trick’ in WDCA A-Grade last Saturday against Western Park. Thomas said later it was his first ‘hat-trick’ in senior cricket. Western Park in another good batting display were 4/184 when Thomas dismissed Peter Ross leg before wicket to start the sequence. Laurie Pitt admits he watched the next delivery pitch well outside the wicket and was surprised when the ball spun back viciously and clean bowled him without a shot being offered. Then Peter Croft obligingly hit the next delivery to mid-on where Les Coster gleefully held the catch as Longwarry players rushed in to congratulate Thomas. The tall Longwarry spinner also dismissed the Western Park openers Neil Robertson and Stuart Tweddle in his 6/62 off 24 overs. Robertson – unaware he was close to a century – went for a big hit and was clean bowled for 99, the highest score of the day. Western Park declared at 9/203 – a good follow up to their losing 9/227 the previous week. Obviously, this young side is on the improve and is no longer a batting bunny. Longwarry – after being faced with disbandment – had a full, if slightly immature team available including captain Elio Meggetto back for this game. However, in two overs before stumps, Longwarry had two batsmen clean bowled for ducks by Laurie Pitt, which was not a bad comeback for the Park fast bowler after being in the middle of a ‘hat-trick’ earlier in the day.”

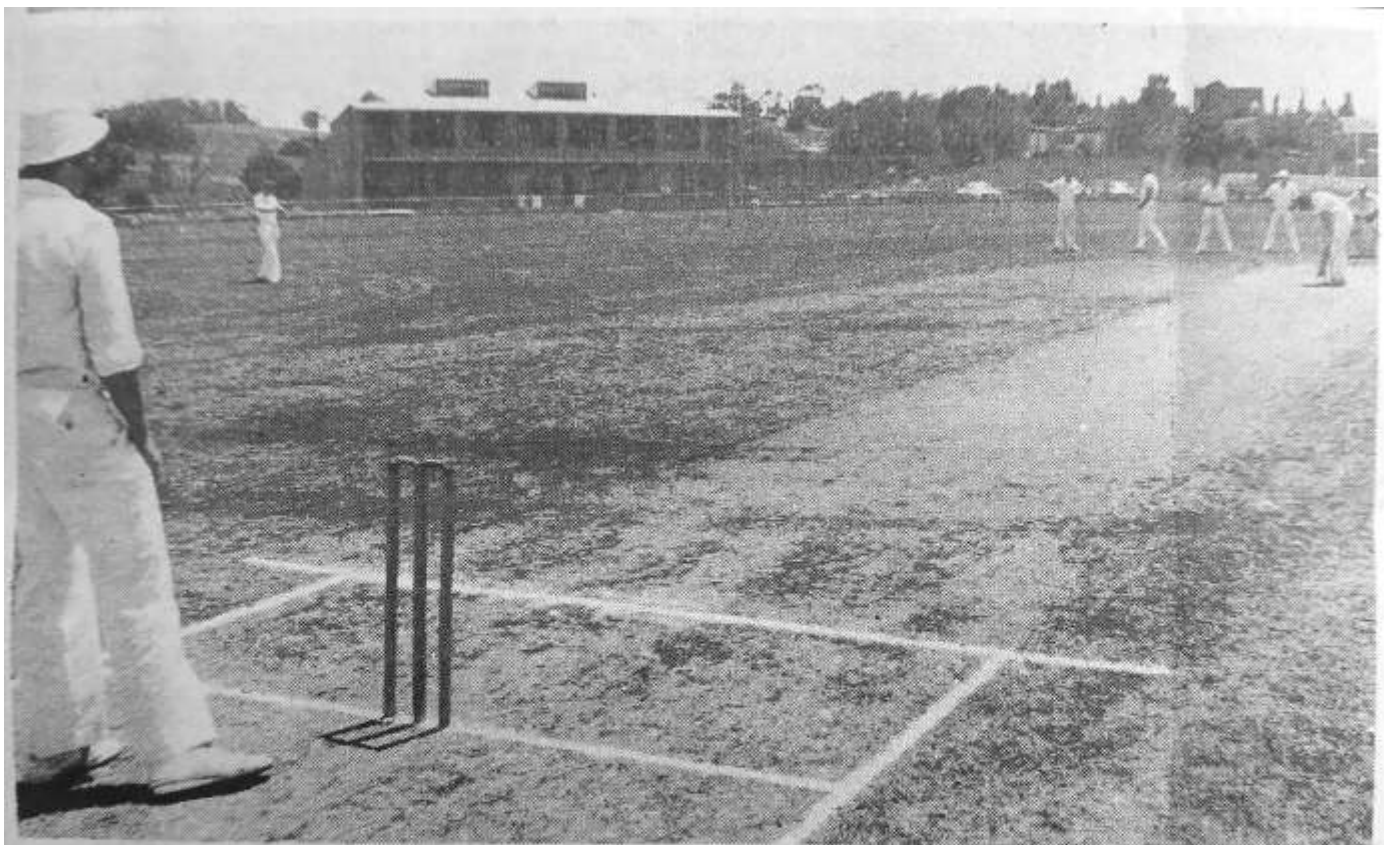

Western Park sensation Cycle marks 'ravage' turf wicket

Boys riding bicycles over Western Park's new turf wicket on Saturday night may have wiped out the second day's play of the Western Park v Yarragon match.

Mr Royce Nuttall, who is advising a large team of workers on turf wicket preparation said the pitch was 'ravaged' by tyre marks.

However, he has not given up hope of play resuming on turf next Saturday.

The boys, who did the damage on Saturday night, came back for a second serve on Sunday and were intercepted by Mr Nuttall.

Their bicycles were still stuck with the black Merri Creek soil churned up by tyres after Mr Nuttall watered the turf wicket area on Saturday at the conclusion of play.

The boys admitted they were the culprits and Mr Nuttall gave them a long dressing down on thoughtless behaviour that undid the work of many people to provide the youth of Warragul with top class sports areas and facilities.

Mr Nuttall told the boys their actions had amounted to serious vandalism that could have landed them in serious trouble with police.

While these lads are unlikely to offend again, the public is urged to keep an unofficial eye on Western Park and immediately report any further vandalism to police or the committee of management.

Warragul sportsmen and women have waited patiently for years to use the splendid facilities at Western Park. They must be protected.

As Mr Nuttall very kindly points out kiddies may be accused for riding over the new turf because "they may not be aware of what is on the go there."

“Western Park and Trafalgar are having a colourful duel on a lively turf wicket at Western Park. With fourth place hinging on the result, the match was approached in semi-final atmosphere. Western Park batted first and were bundled out for 81. Fast bowler John Kane batted well for 29, newcomer Graham Hogan impressed with 15, and captain Neil Robertson – run out for 10 – kept on running to West Gippsland Hospital to meet his new son Aaron Luke, born about the time dad was run out.

Trafalgar’s attack was headed by Peter Goldstraw (6/31) and Geoff Powell (2/25). The Trafalgar innings opened sensationally with Laurie Pitt in superb form for Western Park. Keeping a straight line and attacking the stumps, Pitt dismissed Keith Alger, Neil Grimshaw, Geoff Browne, and Andrew Burns in his first six overs for only two runs. Trafalgar were then 4/14 and tottering badly.

However, Pitt changed his attack to leg theory and Geoff Johns and Peter Goldstraw took 12 off his next two overs – a costly change of tactics. The match is poised at an interesting stage with Trafalgar needing 49 to win with six wickets in hand. The first 10 overs should decide the match next Saturday.”

More Headaches Over Park Turf – *from the Gazette*: “All is not well with the turf wicket at Western Park. Some players claim the turf pitch is not level and has a series of ridges on it. A member of the WDCA executive has told me he will oppose further matches being played there until the fault is rectified. He claims the oval almost needs a full-time curator with time to roll out the uneven spots to bring it up to requirements. Despite last Saturday’s wintry conditions, the pitch played very peacefully as Trafalgar easily overtook the Park’s 81 to win the match and clinch fourth place. It was actually the bowlers who were disadvantaged being unable to gain a foothold on a slippery approach. Overnight rain made it necessary to postpone the special official opening match on Sunday for at least three weeks until after Country Week.”

From the Gazette: “Top four teams Garfield-Bunyip, Warragul, and Trafalgar are well placed in vital WDCA A-Grade clashes with Western Park, Ellinbank, and Drouin. The 1977-78 and 1979-80 premiers have 80 overs to get the reasonably good 207 put together by Western Park on Saturday. Stuart Twedde – playing against former Bunyip teammates – top scored with 53 and six other batsmen were in double figures. Among them was new player Graham Hogan, who hit three fours of the combine’s most successful bowler Eric Preston (4/67) in his quick 15. Whether Western Park can remain a finals hope is squarely up to their attack, but one thing in their favour is the knowledge that Garfield-Bunyip has yet to beat them in the WDCA – and the Park are no longer tailenders.”

From the Gazette: "A piece of chewing gum may cost Warragul their WDCA A-Grade clash with Western Park. Warragul coach Bob Mason – frustrated by bails being blown off stumps on the windswept Marist College No. 2 while he was bowling – decided to use some chewing gum to hold them in place. He did the job so well that when Bill Canobie operating at the other end clean bowled Western Park batsman Alan Ross, the middle and off stumps moved with the impact and twanged back into place held firmly by stay-fast bails which were not dislodged. Exultant Warragul cries of joy turned to dismay as the umpire correctly ruled 'not-out' in favour of the batsman.

Mason apologetically confessing to his teammate that he had forgotten to remove the chewing gum after bowling did little to ease Canobie's erupting blood pressure. However, Ross was delighted and went on to make 79 – top score in the Park's very useful 220. It was one of many highlights in a colourful match. Western Park was 2/3 and 4/32 before big hitting Stony Creek recruit Graham Hogan hit up 47 (with seven fours) in 29 minutes. Then Peter Croft, batting well on 18, had to be taken to West Gippsland Hospital for treatment to a knee injured as he hit a four. He was unable to resume batting and was out retired hurt. The Park was 5/149 at tea and with Ross getting a second hand (thanks to Bob Mason's super-grip chewing gum) and Peter Ross slamming 30 n.o. the Westerners were able to amass 220 – a good score after such a poor start.

Bob Mason – enlightened by team-mates on where chewing gum could be more fittingly placed – redeemed himself by taking 5/55 off 22 overs (including five maidens) to take bowling honours for Warragul. Then in 16 minutes before stumps, Mark Trewella – promoted to opening bowler – had Country Week opener Ian Findlay splendidly caught by his captain Neil Robertson to leave Warragul 1/6 at the close of play. Warragul are third, but as Western Park (seventh) can still make the four with a win in this game, a thrilling finish is expected next Saturday.”

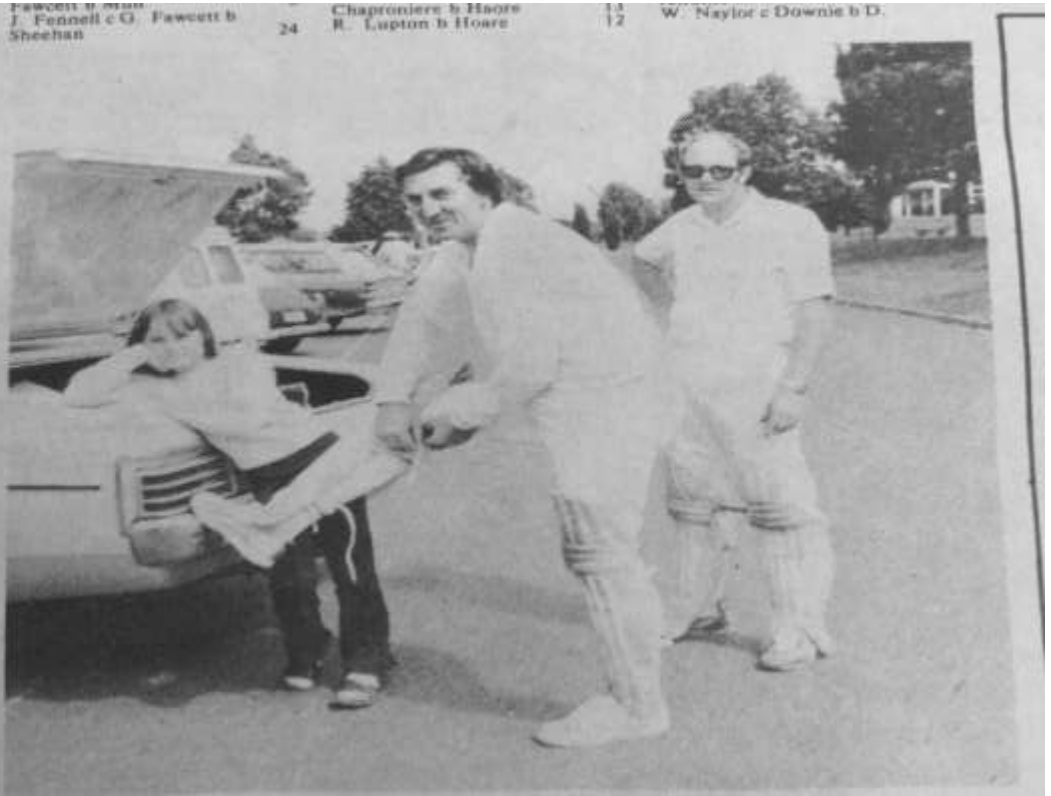

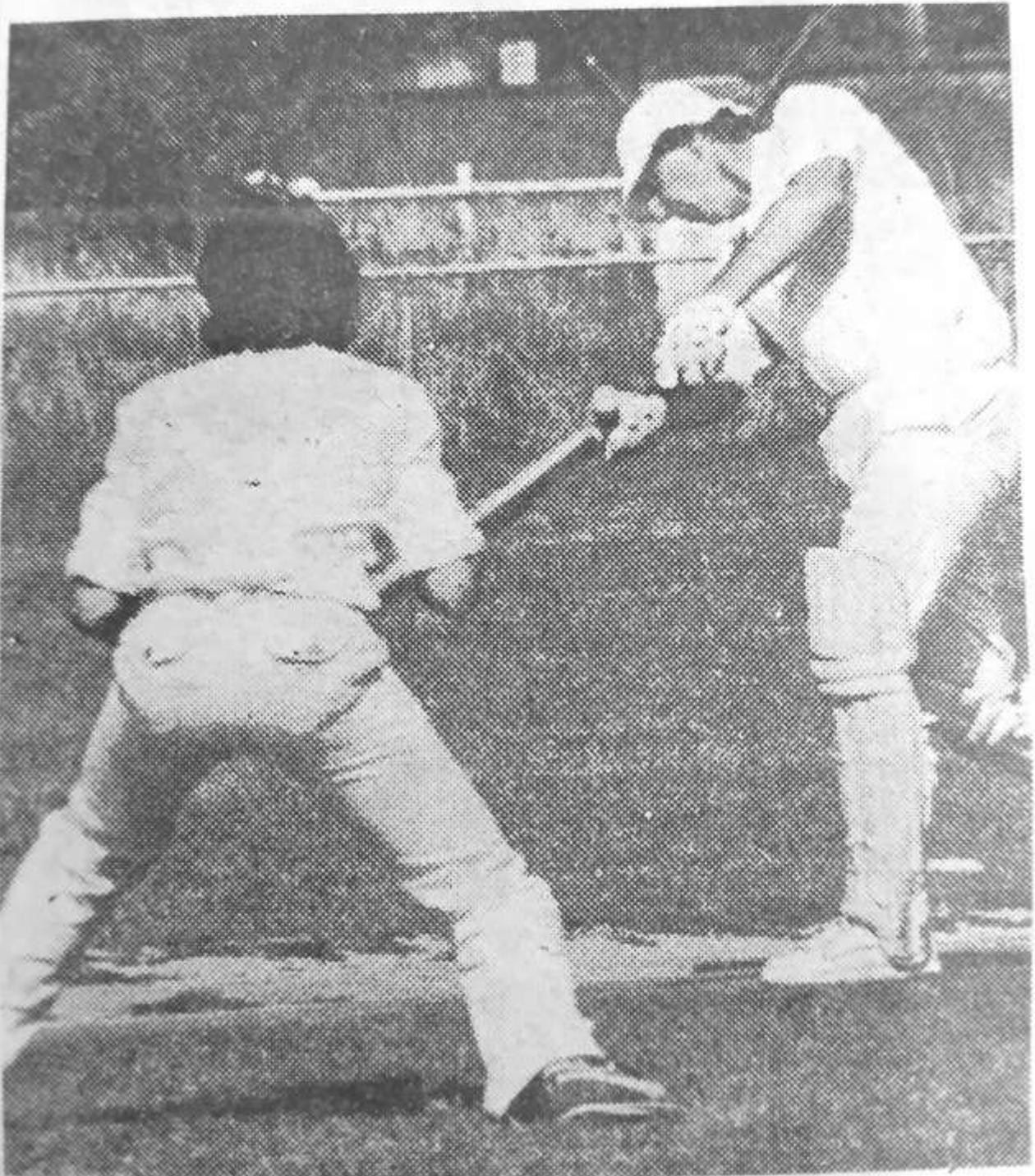
