From the Gazette: "When Garfield-Bunyip batted a whole weekend for 449, it was one short of the Association's highest score record. Western Park replied with the new Association record highest score of 8/455 after batting all last weekend. The match aggregate of 904 runs is an all-time WDCA record for a two-innings match. Four batsmen making centuries in a two-innings match is also probably a record. It is believed the seventh-wicket partnership of 213 by Peter Ross and Ian Glen is a record.

It was Western Park Cricket Club's first premiership, and Laurie Pitt's first as a team captain. Slow bowler George Purton – who did not get a hit – played in his first premiership team after 28 years in cricket. It was a disappointing result for Garfield-Bunyip to lose after making the third-highest score in WDCA history. Chasing 449, Western Park lost 3/47 and recovered to be 6/209 at the end of play on Saturday with Peter Ross 33*, and Ian Glen 4*.

A rash supporter gave a Western Park player a side interest wager of \$200 to \$1. Imagine his thoughts as the score rose to 7/413 before Ross went for a brilliant 150. It was his first senior century, but Ross did make five in succession as a junior player for Western Park (St. Andrews CC). George Nuttall joined Glen and immediately went for runs with 37 still needed and three wickets in hand. This pair passed the Garfield-Bunyip tally and finally Glen – after making his maiden century – was stumped for 100 by Paul Dawes off George Vittiritti (the regular keeper).

Vittiritti – a century maker for Garfield-Bunyip – gave up the wicket-keeping gloves to Dawes when Western Park were recovering on Saturday through Rohan Glen (86) and Bruce Osborne (42). He finished with 4/67 off 20 overs to emerge as the Man-of-the-Match. Garfield-Bunyip – who had their club wind-up on Saturday night – could not believe the part fate played on them next day. Leading by 246 with only four tail-end batsmen to dismiss, they could not believe that Western Park only lost one of those wickets in getting the necessary runs."
